 - iii. I lie or sit on the berth!
 - iv. If my inmates are positive!
10. When will I reach home?
11. When will I meet my family?
12. How is my loved ones thinking about me?
13. Which Quarantine Centre will I be placed?
14. When will the doctor come for swab test?




15. Why I am not given medicine?

Life seems hopeless! Their psychological struggle is more than their physical stress. Their life situation is not better in their homeland than in mainland Indian. At this juncture, to sing "we shall overcome" seems difficult for them. Yet, as a believer of Christ we surely believe that sooner we will overcome, as the word of God assures us, **"My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness (2 Cor12:9).** What more can we expect....??

I personally thank the Ministry Team from various churches for availing their services to share the gospel and offer prayers for the inmates. I do thank the Counselors for their concern and support in times of trouble. Last but far from the least, I thank the Ministry & Counseling Committee members Mrs. Henitoli Child Promoter, Pastor Nivukhu & Pastor Charlie for their constant support in the ministry.

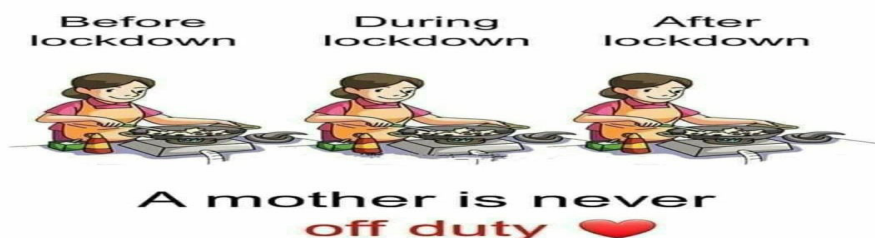

Take the jobs migrant workers left, Rio tells Nagaland

Nagaland Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio has urged the people to fill the economic sectors in the state that have been left by migrant workers.

"Our state, we are not producing society, we are consumer society," Rio said on Monday. He said that the people depend solely on the government and "fight" for government jobs. That is why the 'state's economy is salary economy.'

The chief minister said that the people should start talking about the economy of the state and try to work. He called upon the people to "take over the jobs" of the migrant labourers, who left the state during the lockdown. He said that over 4,000 people had left Nagaland but fortunately over 13,000 returnees had arrived in the state. 'Now our migrants have left for us to take the jobs,' Rio said. (EMN)

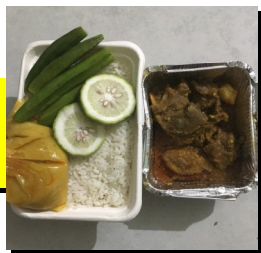

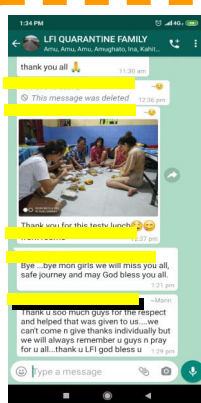

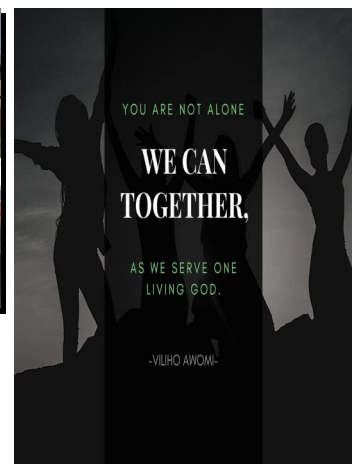
